



4-1. Undergraduate Admissions

4-1-1. Trends in Undergraduate Admissions

For general admission to Kyushu University's undergraduate programs, the application ratio ranges between 3.2 to 3.8. At 3.28, the ratio of Kyushu University entrance examination applicants to spaces available was the lowest ever in FY 2020. The nationwide, as well, the ratio of applicants to places of national universities is on the decline.






4-1-2. Trends in Undergraduate Admissions: General Admission

The ratio of applicants to places ranges between 2.4 and 2.7 in the first selection, and between 8.0 and 9.9 in the second selection, so the university is able to secure a stable supply of entrants. At national universities across Japan, enrollment capacity is decreasing.




















While the situation differs from one graduate school to another, most graduate schools are managing to secure international applicants.




4-2-2. Trends in Graduate Admissions: Professional Degree Programs

Looking at applications to professional degree programs for this fiscal year at Kyushu University, the number of applicants increased for the Law School and the Professional Graduate School of Public Health. However, there was a slight drop in the number of applicants to the Business School and a significant decline in the number of applicants to the Professional Graduate School of Applied Clinical Psychology.





4-2-3. Trends in Graduate Admissions: Doctoral Programs
