

Every year, Kyushu University is able to secure more undergraduate entrants than its enrollment capacity.



● How to Read the Rankings (Quoted from the Source) Desirable Schools for Parents

Daigaku Tsushin conducted an online survey among members of the public nationwide and ranked universities by topic.

The survey period was in 2019. There were 1,000 respondents and the survey targeted company employees and public officials who had graduated from university. The survey was conducted without any regional bias and the ratio of men to women respondents was roughly 1 to 1. Respondents were requested to rank 3 universities, with 3 points given to the top-ranked university, 2 points to the second, and 1 point to the third, for each of the following lists: 3 Universities Throughout Japan and 3 Universities in Local or Surrounding Areas.

5-4-2. Trends in Graduate Enrollment: Doctoral Programs (by School)


