



#### KPI: Number of students studying abroad






KPI: Number of international faculty and faculty with international experience

KPI: Articles published with international coauthors over a 5-year period



KPI: Articles published in top ten percent journals over a 5-year period



KPI: Percentage of young researchers







#### KPI: Percentage of international scholars






#### KPI: Joint research funding

#### KPI: Number of university start-ups




#### Reference: Joint Collaborative Research with Private Sector, Breakdown of Accepted Amounts by Size (FY2021)








